Turyaa, stands tall and majestic on the IT corridor of OMR (Chennai) and is at a visible distance from the beach – a perfect spot to take a break from work or chill out over a weekend at. With a rating of 'Five Star Deluxe' in hand, Turyaa is a perfect business and leisure hotel, with its name derived from Sanskrit that means "pure consciousness".

Stepping into Turyaa can make your heart skip a beat with its lavishing entrance reflecting pink, and purple shades and also, particularly when you realise that the Santa Clause seated at the mighty piano there is a mere mannequin! The realistic looking figurine could cheat your eyes and do not be surprised if your children run to the structure clad in red, expecting a gift! Up next is the Nativity Scene that's set up using cardboard, plywood, pebbles, stones and sprouted cereals for grass.

Turyaa's lobby is attractively set up with stars, and tree cut-outs dangling and holding staff's pictures as a token of appreciation and citation of unity. One of the most marvellous pieces of decoration is the flamboyant, eight-layered bottle (has around 2018 bottles) art that stands lofty and proud. It's erected in the shape of a Christmas tree and is made using plywood, metal rods, LED lights and has a star on the top. And last, but not the least, is









the marvellous looking five-layered Christmas tree - placed in the lobby at Mista - made using every piece of dump in the hotel. For setting up the tree, bamboo sticks, sleeping iron rods, standing PVC pipes, chicken mesh, old newspapers, shredded used-papers, green spray and green net were used. Decorative items used to embellish the Christmas tree in particular and Turyaa in general are made of plastic bottles, thermocol, paper and glitters. Apart from these, rain boots and pasted cotton contributed to making socks, while waste-tree-branches put together made the medium-sized tress reflecting the winter season.

Thus, Turyaa which houses the carving of Kalpaurishka - the wishfulfilling tree - on its wall, has lived up to the virtue it stands by: being eco-friendly! With immense support, contribution and involvement from every staff in the hotel, Turyaa has decked itself up uniquely for the season, leaving no stone unturned to have their guests' jaw drop!
